## UGANDA – It Takes a Village

Currently, Michael's House has been using our three farms, Ryan-Rice Farm, Grace Farm, and Audrey's Farm, located two hours from Kampala, to plant crops in the fertile soil, raise and graze animals, and supply the water necessary for all these activities.

A new use for these farms will be the construction of a village that will consist of individual living/sleeping quarters in blocks of six and a communal area that will be used as a kitchen and a social gathering place. This new usage will bring back the elderly who are now begging and sleeping in the streets of Kampala to a village where they will live and work to become self-sustaining and restore a sense of self-worth so long denied.

This project will be separately funded and will not come out of daily operating expenses. The bricks used for construction, are being made by locals at the cost of 7 shillings per brick (2000 shillings to a US dollar)
